





The parables of the Bible are simple, easy-to-remember stories that Jesus told. Even though the stories are simple, they have deeper meanings.




There once was a rich king. The king's servants owed him money.






The king decided to have his servants settle their accounts. Many of the servants quickly paid their debts. But one servant owed one thousand coins.







The servant could not pay, and the king became angry.

The servant fell to his knees and cried. "Please, great king. Have patience! I will pay you everything," he begged.




The king felt sorry for the servant. He decided to be patient and let the servant slowly pay off his debt.






